
Homebuilding Highlights

Over the summer homebuilding season we had 16 priests and one deacon participate in the build weeks from five different jurisdictions and ten different states.

- The Project Mexico Homebuilding worship pavilion was improved by installing seven new icons for the altar.
- 512 homebuilding trip participants (20,480 volunteer hours).
- 8 weeks of homebuilding programming.

• 25 homes were built for families in the Tijuana region (the most for a homebuilding summer in our history).

21 interns (over 6,528 volunteer hours).
24 day trip participants (960 volunteer hours).



• Launch of "Painting Hope" program where we use Lime Wash to paint Project Mexico homes and other homes in neighborhoods. Volunteers painted over 10 homes during the homebuilding construction.

 Launch of "Panel Jamboree" which invites volunteers to travel to St. Innocent Orphanage to volunteer.



• Three of the youngest boys have become part of the altar boy team. Their joy and love for serving brings life to Chapel worship.
