

St. Innocent Orphanage Highlights...

HEALTH & WELL-BEING

- To improve the mental and emotional health of our boys, our psychologists held weekly group and individual counseling sessions focused on:
 - Ages 10-14: behavior & anger management, self-esteem & independence, living together, conflict resolution, abandonment, and information processing.
 - Ages 15-18: emotions management, assertiveness, empathy, decision making, problem solving, expression of emotions, and mental distress.
- Our kitchen staff has worked hard to create a balanced diet for the boys! Each meal has fruits, dairy, grains, protein, and vegetables from our very own garden.
- To encourage autonomy, we decreased the number of boys per living space from four to two.

RENOVATIONS

- A new galvanized orphanage front gate was donated and installed by Peter Andruchow. It has our name displayed and it's adorned with a traditional Orthodox cross.
- For the first time in 17 years, the chapel iconostasis was repaired and repainted by iconographer, Antonia Franck, alongside some of our talented staff, Tony, Mary, Seraphima, Emily, and Fritz.
- With help from our staff, the boys worked together to revitalized the old pig barn. The herd has grown to over 24 pigs and we also have 6 cows, 17 rabbits, 15 chickens, 3 sheep, and 5 ducks.
- During the off-season, the Ristagno family repainted the orphanage kitchen, and two *Orthodox San Diego* groups stuccoed the outdoor showers and repainted the boys' dorm rooms.

"Last year, one of our youngest boys started school with so much anxiety and self-doubt. Homework time was close to a nightmare. Today, he chooses to sit as close as possible to my desk and work quietly through his homework smiling, a hand on my shoulder, and proudly asks me to check his work."

SPIRITUAL

- We have made a concerted effort to teach the boys how to apply the Orthodox Faith into all aspects of their lives.
- The Divine Liturgy is now being chanted by all the boys, with the older boys leading the younger novices.
- Our team of altar boys has doubled in the past year as we have fully trained the youngest boys who are now very active in the care of the altar.
- In order to gain a deeper understanding of Orthodoxy, the older boys engaged in an 8-week course about the history of the Church.

EDUCATION

- Our boys achieved a cumulative academic average of 8.0 (equivalent to a "B" average). We are very proud of them!
- This fall we launched *Programa Exito* (Program Success) to homeschool four of our middle school boys. It is already proving to be a huge success!
- A total of 51 chapter books and over 100 picture books and short stories were read by our boys this year.

RECREATION

- Andres and Ivan competed in the *Chivas* national soccer tournament in Guadalajara. Ivan was named "All Star" for most goals scored!
- We took the boys on a family vacation this summer traveling 2700km in just seven days. We camped, fished, ate strange foods, played games, prayed, and simply enjoyed being together.

Home Building Highlights

- From September 2013 to September 2014, over 439 volunteers and 19 volunteer staff came to Mexico to build homes for impoverished families in desperate need and to complete various projects at the orphanage.
- Our volunteers came from 19 U.S. states and 2 Canadian provinces, making up 49 parish groups in total.
- This summer, 19 homes were constructed for a total of 21 families, with over 11,488 volunteer labor hours.
 - Of these 21 families, we housed: 54 children, 37 parents and 10 elderly.
 - During Orthodox Basic Training #2, 150 volunteers built 8 houses in one week, on the same block, literally transforming a neighborhood.
 - Throughout the week, we were blessed by the words of our guest speakers: Archbishop Benjamin, Dn. Theodore Brinegar, Fr. Andrew Cuneo, Fr. Gerasim Eliel, Fr. Anthony Karbo, and Fr. Basil & Mat. Joan Rhodes.
- At the close of the summer, we said goodbye to our newlywed Work Trip Coordinators, Jenny, Mary, and Tony, and we welcomed our new coordinators, also newlywed, Zachariah and Sophia Swanson!


OUR MISSION
